A word from our Chaplain

Our brains are built to protect us from threat. Have you heard of fight, flight, freeze or faun reflex? Most of us have but, in case you haven't let me explain it to you. It's when the very core part of your brain; called the amygdala, sends out messages on how to respond if it feels under threat or in danger. These signals are sent so we survive; lashing out in anger, increased heart rate, sweating, running away and becoming numb. We have zero control of our amygdala. If this reflex happens often, we call this anxiety. Our breathing, focus, sleep, relationships and health can be affected by anxiety. Thankfully anxiety can be treated through therapy, exposure and medication. However, most of the time, the best thing which can help is a friend. We can't help when our in-built protector (our amygdala) kicks into action, but we can have those around us who are patient, kind, and let us know we aren't alone. Part of my role as chaplain is to just be a friend who is calm, patient and caring.
