## Grade 4—Grade 6

In the coming weeks in Literacy we'll be focussing on persuasive texts and will take part in mini-debates on a number of interesting topics. The Grade 3-6 group have begun travelling around the world in Geography using 'Passports' to visit and learn about Australia and other countries. In Numeracy we've been practising using grid co-ordinates and doing mapping. We'll also be looking at angles, 3D shapes and the reflection, translation and rotation of shapes.
